- physical or sexual force, actual or threatened; psychological/ emotional abuse, verbal abuse, and economic/financial abuse
- primarily men towards women, typically by partner or ex-partner but any family member



- often these crimes happens in a pattern
- meant to scare, intimidate or humiliate, or to make a person feel powerless



- 83% of reported incidents are against females
- only 22% of domestic crime in Canada is actually reported


In 2013, almost 7 in 10 family violence victims were female.

In 2013, almost 8 in 10 spousal violence victims were female.



- most often reported if they were physically injured, feared for their lives or had a greater number of incidents
- 95% did so because they wanted the violence to end and to receive protection

Every 6 days....



...a woman in Canada is **murdered** by her intimate partner.

- Over the years, the rate of intimate partner homicide against women is actually increasing
- Sixty percent of the dating violence occurs after the woman has left the relationship



For Intimate Partner Violence cases that were completed in adult criminal courts....








of all female victims of spousal murder, were killed after they left the relationship.

There's no place

- 25% of all violent crimes reported to police involve family violence.
- 70% of the victims of police-reported family violence are girls or women.
- 25% of all police-reported violence against children and youth are committed by a family member, with girls four times more likely than boys to be victims of sexual assault or other sexual offences by a family member.
- Police-reported rates of intimate partner violence are highest among women 25 to 34 years of age.
- 65% of spouses accused of homicide had a history of family violence involving the victim. This was most often the case when the spousal victim was estranged from their partner, including those divected and separated.



- in Canada on April 16, 2014:
- 627 shelters for abused women
- 338 women and their 201 children weren't allowed in, 56% due to it being full



• Women who leave a partner to raise a child on her own is five times more likely to be poor than if she stayed





- for 85% of the reported incidents, police came to the location of the incident
- after police involvement,
 incidents of spousal violence
 decreased for 48% of female
 victims, stayed the same for
 23% and increased for 6%



Restraining Order Request wen in this application form You are authorized . and each

- I in 7 female victims of spousal violence get a restraining order
- in 2009, I 5% obtained a restraining or protection order



- 32% of these orders were breached
- 65% of the female victims who had the order breached reported it



8 in 10 women victimized by their spouse told family, friends or another source of informal support.

 84% of the reported spousal incidents to the police were done by the female victims themselves
